


Staffing Footprint

As we continue to navigate the complexities of providing an exceptional education for all students, one of our top priorities is the responsible management of our staffing footprint. Ensuring that we have the right balance of staff across our schools and departments is crucial not only for maintaining high-quality educational experiences but also for being good stewards of district resources.

We are committed to thoughtfully evaluating our staffing needs to align with student enrollment, programmatic demands, and budget constraints. This approach allows us to ensure that we are providing the necessary support for our students and staff while also maintaining fiscal responsibility. By carefully assessing staffing levels and making data-driven decisions, we strive to maximize our resources and continue to offer outstanding opportunities for learning and growth.

The graphic below illustrates that at Lakeview we are on track to balancing staffing with enrollment trends. We responded to the pandemic by increasing academic support and have since continued to reduce through attrition. We are often told to bring back teachers, but doing so needs to be examined through multiple lenses. The data shows us closing the gap to fiscal responsibility based on enrollment.



The chart above shows the change in Lakeview's enrollment over the last fifteen years in orange. Declining enrollment is not a Lakeview spécific issue, it is occurring in all Trumbull County Schools.

The blue line shows the level of staffing compared to enrollment. Ideally, the two lines meet. This data was captured last school year, for reference, this year the staffing numbers are more in line with 2020 levels.
